



⁶So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." ⁹When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. ¹¹They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."






This is Christ's Banquet. It is made ready for those who love God, and for those who want to love God more. So, come, you who have much faith and you who have little, you who have been here often, and you who have not been here long. You who have tried to follow Jesus, and you who have failed. Come, because it is Christ who invites you.

During Communion, all are welcome – even encouraged! – to come forward to receive the holy food of new and everlasting life in Jesus Christ. Simply put your hands out (one on top of the other), and the bread will be placed in your hand. (If needed, gluten-free wafers are available.)

You may then consume the wafer (if you do not wish to have it intincted in the wine) or leave the wafer on your palm and the chalice bearer will dip it into the wine for you and place it in your hand. If you aren't sure, or if you'd rather not receive the actual Sacrament, come up and cross your arms across your chest to receive a blessing. You may also cross your arms over your chest or touch the bottom of the chalice if you wish not to receive wine. Finally, if you'd like to receive Communion but mobility is an issue, alert an usher and Communion will be brought to you.

A note about today's prelude:

Olivier Messiaen, one of the greatest composers of the 20th century, had a profound and mystical faith. In order to express his faith in his music, he developed his own unique, personal harmonic language.

In 1932-33, he composed a suite for orchestra titled *L'Ascension* (The Ascension), a series of movements reflecting on the ascension of Christ into heaven forty days after the first Easter. In 1934, he arranged the suite for organ; however, because of the difficulties of arranging the third orchestral movement, he wrote an entirely new third movement for organ. The organ version was premiered a few days before the orchestral version, and remains more popular than the orchestral version today.

Messiaen intended the final movement, *Prayer of Christ ascending to his Father*, to be the "emotional peak" of *L'Ascension*. Marked "extremely slow," it is serene and timeless. The movement is built around an ascending melody, supported by richly colorful chords. The harmonies are voiced in such a way that only three chords in the entire movement have a traditional foundation, which makes the music feel as if it is suspended in the air. The movement ends without a final resolution, perhaps implying that the ascension is not the end—there is more to come.

Under the title of this movement, Messiaen placed this scriptural quotation: "And now, O Father, I have manifested your name to humanity . . . and now I am no longer in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to you." John 17: 6, 11

What Does It Mean to Love and Serve God?

Each week we pray God "Send us now into the world in peace to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart." What does it mean to love and serve God in our everyday lives? **Education for Ministry** (EfM) is a four-year program of theological education that can help you answer that question. EfM is designed for lay people -- all of us! -- who are interested in deepening their understanding of the Christian faith and exploring their ministry as lay persons.

Through EfM, you will:

- Study the Bible, church history, and theology.
- Engage in theological reflection and discussion.
- Build deep relationships with other people of faith.
