FIRST READING: Jeremiah 18:1-11

The people sit.

A Reading from the book of the prophet Jeremiah.

¹The word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD: ²“Come, go down to the potter’s house, and there I will let you hear my words.” ³So I went down to the potter’s house, and there he was working at his wheel. ⁴The vessel he was making of clay was spoiled in the potter’s hand, and he reworked it into another vessel, as seemed good to him.

⁵Then the word of the LORD came to me: ⁶Can I not do with you, O house of Israel, just as this potter has done? says the LORD. Just like the clay in the potter’s hand, so are you in my hand, O house of Israel. ⁷At one moment I may declare concerning a nation or a kingdom, that I will pluck up and break down and destroy it, ⁸but if that nation, concerning which I have spoken, turns from its evil, I will change my mind about the disaster that I intended to bring on it. ⁹And at another moment I may declare concerning a nation or a kingdom that I will build and plant it, ¹⁰but if it does evil in my sight, not listening to my voice, then I will change my mind about the good that I had intended to do to it. ¹¹Now, therefore, say to the people of Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem: Thus says the LORD: Look, I am a potter shaping evil against you and devising a plan against you. Turn now, all of you from your evil way, and amend your ways and your doings.

SECOND READING: Philemon 1-21

A Reading from Paul's letter to Philemon.

¹Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother,

To Philemon our dear friend and co-worker, ²to Apphia our sister, to Archippus our fellow soldier, and to the church in your house:

³Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

⁴When I remember you in my prayers, I always thank my God ⁵because I hear of your love for all the saints and your faith toward the Lord Jesus. ⁶I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective when you perceive all the good that we may do for Christ. ⁷I have indeed received much joy and encouragement from your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, my brother.

⁸For this reason, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do your duty, ⁹yet I would rather appeal to you on the basis of love—and I, Paul, do this as an old man, and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus. ¹⁰I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. ¹¹Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful both to you and to me. ¹²I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. ¹³I wanted to keep him with me, so that he might be of service to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel; ¹⁴but I preferred to do nothing without your consent, in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced.

¹⁵Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back forever, ¹⁶no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a beloved brother—especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

¹⁷So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. ¹⁸If he has wronged you in any way, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. ¹⁹I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it. I say nothing about your owing me even your own self. ²⁰Yes, brother, let me have this benefit from you in the Lord! Refresh my heart in Christ. ²¹Confident of your obedience, I am writing to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say.

DISTRIBUTION

The ministers receive the Sacrament in both kinds, and then immediately deliver it to the people.

Celebrant This is Christ's Banquet. It is made ready for those who love God, and for those who want to love God more. So, come, you who have much faith and you who have little, you who have been here often, and you who have not been here long. You who have tried to follow Jesus, and you who have failed. Come, because it is Christ who invites you.

During Communion, all are welcome – even encouraged! – to come forward to receive the holy food of new and everlasting life in Jesus Christ. Simply to the Celebrant when the ushers indicate, put your hands out (one on top of the other), and the bread will be placed in your hand. (If needed, gluten-free wafers are available.)

You may then consume the wafer (if you do not wish to have it intincted in the wine) or leave the wafer on your palm and the chalice bearer will dip it for you into the wine and place it in your hand. If you aren't sure, or if you'd rather not receive the actual Sacrament, come up and cross your arms across your chest to receive a blessing. You may also cross your arms over your chest or touch the bottom of the chalice if you wish not to receive wine. Finally, if you'd like to receive Communion but mobility is an issue, alert an usher and Communion will be brought to you

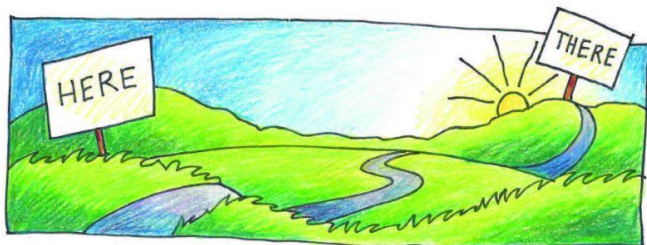

A LETTER FROM THE VICAR



Dear Epiphany Family,

Ready for some good news? Well, a couple of months ago your Bishop's Committee made a commitment to plan for our future. We have decided to join other Episcopal churches nationwide who have participated in taking a comprehensive survey of spiritual life that can help provide valuable information to our parish on **our journey of faith as a congregation**. The survey, referred to as the Spiritual Life Inventory, was created by RenewalWorks, an Episcopal organization charged with advancing spiritual growth. It is an in-depth assessment of an individual parishioner's spiritual beliefs and practices, as well as the Church's role and support for that person's spiritual development. These individual findings – which are *collected anonymously*– are then aggregated to depict our parish-wide view. The results will allow an appointed team here at Epiphany to put together an in-depth profile of our entire congregation, providing invaluable insights to help guide the strategic planning process.

Since this survey was developed in 2004, over 300,000 Christians have taken it, representing 15,000 congregations, including many Episcopal parishes. As a result, there is a very robust database with which we can compare and contrast Epiphany's survey results to help us understand and measure our spiritual growth. We are excited to announce that in just a few weeks we will be sending you a link to the Epiphany Spiritual Assessment Inventory survey, which **will only require about 20 minutes to complete**.

In addition to your attendance in worship, as well as your sacrificial giving to enable God's mission, I often ask you for your time. Sometimes my request centers on different ministries or on our annual Ministry Fair or Fundraiser, other times it is because I am hoping you will participate in different councils of the Church whether on the parish level or on the diocesan level. Today, I am writing to ask for your time in a very different and spiritually significant way. In a way that will give you a chance to voice your feelings about...

- Where we have been as a parish
- Where we are now
- Where we feel called to go
- How we will get there

We will be sending you more information weekly as we approach the Inventory launch date. It is my hope that you will all become as excited and eager to participate in this plan for our spiritual and physical growth as we on the Bishop's Committee already are. I ask for your prayers and your commitment as together we embark on this wonderful journey of discovering where God is leading us.
