

#### THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sin. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

#### THE PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

We observe a time of silence between each petition, offering our own intercessions, until the leader says, "Lord hear us."





**Trio Céleste** returns to the Church of the Epiphany in a concert to benefit the Epiphany Music Guild. #### **ABOUT THE CHOIRS**

Two recent questions are: why we don't have a choir singing every week, and why there are so few singers?

Because of the delta variant of COVID-19, a number of our singers are reluctant to return at this time. In the meantime, a faithful remnant carries on our choral tradition. In addition, Bishop Taylor has asked that churches refrain from having choirs involving children until such time as children can be vaccinated. Since the Choristers sang one Sunday a month, that leaves us, at present, with one Sunday each month without a choir. We hope this ends soon, and we thank you for your support and encouragement!

# VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: "ALL" (ACOLYTES, LAY READERS, AND LAY EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS)

Our worship relies on volunteers to fill key roles. Perhaps you are being called to support Jamie in the leading of our communal worship. There are opportunities for you to help!

Acolytes assist with the service by lighting candles before the service, by carrying the torches (candles) and the processional cross, by receiving the congregation's offerings at the end of the offertory, and by performing other needed duties. Youth Acolytes is an important way that young people can help lead our worship. Those 6<sup>th</sup> grade/11 years old (or older) are invited to join. If you are past high school age, you can be a pioneer in the new ministry of Adult Acolytes. Training will be necessary before serving and will be provided. If you are interested in this ministry, please speak with Jamie or Laurie Burns.

Our **Lay readers** (also called Lectors) read the Old Testament and New Testament Lessons, lead the reading of the Psalm by the congregation, (cont'd next column)

and lead us in intercessory prayer. Individuals need to be trained before the first time they read. If you are interested in this ministry, please speak with Jay.

Lay Eucharistic Ministers help the priest during communion by administering the chalice to members of the congregation. If you are interested in this ministry, please speak with Jamie. NOTE: Because of COVID, we are not administering the chalice at the present time, but we will need volunteers when the administration of wine resumes.


