




The ministers receive the Sacrament in both kinds, and then immediately deliver it to the people.

Presider

This is Christ's Banquet. It is made ready for those who love God, and for those who want to love God more. So, come, you who have much faith and you who have little, you who have been here often, and you who have not been here long. You who have tried to follow Jesus, and you who have gotten lost. Come, because it is Christ who invites you.

During the distribution of Communion, we welcome you to receive the sacrament or a prayer of blessing. If receiving a blessing, please come forward and simply cross your hands over your chest as you walk up to the presider. If you would like a gluten-free wafer, please tell the presider when you reach the front.

Put your hands out one on top of the other, and the wafer will be placed in your hand. Leave the wafer in place and move to the chalice bearer, who will then take it, dip it in the wine, and hand it back to you. If you do not wish to receive the wine, simply consume the wafer and then you may place your hands on the base of the chalice and the chalice bearer will say the words of administration.


Our faith calls us to care for creation because the earth, our common home, is God's gift to all. As I ponder on how to write about **Creation Care** during this Christmas season, I am mindful

With this in mind, how can we celebrate the season in harmony with God's gift of creation? Take some time to pray. Invite Christ who became human just like us to replace our longing for stuff with a longing for a simple and sustainable life, and for a commitment to caring for our common home.

Here are a few ideas.

- Purchase cards from eco-friendly vendors or creatively recycle old cards.
- Try brown paper bags or newspaper for wrapping.
- Shop for gifts that are useful and sustainable gifts of experience or gifts of service gifts of food are they healthy and sustainable?
- Eat less, some estimates suggest that as much as 40% of Christmas food is thrown away.
